12 Justices of the Peace present. Justice Mike Hawkins was absent.

Judge Ed Hill called the meeting to order.

**Tony Supine** from Camfill-Farr addressed the Court concerning Camfill-Farr's request for a refund of sales tax paid on expansion of their business. **Supine** said they are making a \$2.6 million dollar investment that will expand business and add more employees. Currently limited office space has prevented the hiring of needed employees.

Justice Fred Bowers moved to pass the resolution approving the tax refund to Camfill-Farr. The motion was seconded by Justice Ken Stacks.

The Court approved the resolution by a vote of 11-0 with Justice **Hawkins** absent and Justice **Josh Longmire** recusing himself – *Appendix 1*.

Judge Hill provided an update on the Bono Lake Project and a slideshow of work being done at the project site was shown.

**Dan Melton** addressed the Court concerning a potential resolution to voice opposition to a "Blueway" Mcmorandum of Understanding. The resolution was prepared by a group called **Secure Arkansas** – *Appendix 2*.

Justice Terry Couch moved to adjourn the meeting. The motion was seconded by Justice Jim Bryant.

# Tax Back Resolution

### RESOLUTION No. 2013-07

RESOLUTION OF THE QUORUM COURT OF CRAIGHEAD COUNTY, ARKANSAS, CERTIFYING LOCAL GOVERNMENT ENDORSEMENT OF BUSINESS TO PARTICIPATE IN THE TAX BACK PROGRAM (AS AUTHORIZED BY SECTION 15-4-2706(d) OF THE CONSOLIDATED INCENTIVE ACT OF 2003).

**WHEREAS**, in order to be considered for participation in the Tax Back Program, the local government must endorse a business to participate in the Tax Back Program; and

WHEREAS, the local government must authorize the refund of local sales and use tax as provided in the Consolidated incentive Act of 2003; and

**WHEREAS**, said endorsement must be made on specific form available from the Arkansas Economic Development Commission; and

**WHEREAS,** Camfil APC, located at 3505 S. Airport Road, Jonesboro, Arkansas, has sought to participate in the program and more specifically has requested benefits accruing from adding New Construction, to the specific facility; and

**WHEREAS**, Camfil APC, has agreed to furnish the local government all necessary information for compliance.

# NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE QUORUM COURT OF CRAIGHEAD COUNTY, ARKANSAS, THAT:

- Camfil APC, be endorsed by the Quorum Court of Craighead County, Arkansas for benefits from the sales & use tax refunds as provided by Section 15-4-2706(d) of the Consolidated Incentive Act of 2003.
- The Department of Finance and Administration is authorized to refund local sales and use taxes to Camfil APC.
- This resolution shall take effect immediately.

Appendix 1

The Blueway is a very broad spectrum, all-encompassing program that will be very unkind to property owners and their unalienable rights that protect them. It represents an end-run around Constitutional law. The Blueway will adversely affect both ranchers and farmers in the county, as well as the support base centered around those functions: businesses like the feed stores, the hardware stores, tack shops, farriers, real estate people, county fair functions, co-ops, farm equipment dealers and maintenance shops, large animal veterinarians, health care providers & hospitals, restaurants, fuel depots, schools, etc. etc. If the farmers, ranchers and rural land owners cannot function freely, then the rural and small towns and hamlets in Arkansas and Missouri will ultimately dry up as an industry in this federally designated corridor called the Blueway.

The Blueway is presented as some warm and fuzzy program to protect the environment, when in fact it is an unlawful federal land grab with an end run game plan to drive you off of your land, so some obscure endangered species won't be threatened by man's progress. Think of an Environmental Impact Study on steroids, and you have the Blueway. Progress won't be just thwarted for several months or years; it will be halted altogether. Several years back, the nation all watched in horror when the California Fish and Game Commission ruled in favor of the Long fin and Delta smelt (a two inch minnow) over the livelihoods of 60,000 workers and land owners in California's San Joaquin Valley, considered by many to be the richest and most productive farmland in the nation. The environmentalists shut off the water pumps to farmers, prohibiting them from irrigating their fields. Aside from the vast loss in food production to the world, the workers all went on unemployment overnight! With an annual rainfall of 12 inches, the place looked like a dust bowl in a few short months. Any farmer will tell us, once you uncover the land, and then don't water it, nothing will grow there again. Duh. The same mentality pushing the Blueways is the same mentality that shut that water off. Animal protection takes priority over humans. Economic growth is the enemy to the Environmentalists and to their god, Mother Nature. It is really a religion of sorts to these people. The White River National Blueway will help to terminate economic activity in and around the 17.8 million acres shown on the map. Running water and moving water becomes the yoke around the neck of those who live in this area.

### RESOLUTION NO. 2013 -

Be it resolved by the Commission of the County of	, State of Arkansas
A Resolution to be Entitled:	

A Resolution of Opposition to the January 9, 2013 "designation" and "recognition" of the White River and its Watershed as the "Second National Blueway"; and special Opposition to a "Blueway" Memorandum of Understanding being entered into by federal and state bureaucrats pertaining to our lands and waters due to lack of proper notification or invitation, and due to failure to seek approval, involvement, or input of any kind from County.

- 1. WHEREAS, on Jamuary 9, 2013 agents of the U.S. Department of Interior hosted in Little Rock an announcement/news release ceremony to announce that the White river and its watershed (17.8 million acres across 60 counties in Arkansas and Missouri) "had been named the nation's second National Blueway". The only two U.S. congressional delegates named as being present for the announcement were neither one a representative of the vast area of north Arkansas pertaining to the White River/Watershed. The three U.S. congressional delegates who do represent the White River/Watershed area of Arkansas, Senator John Boozman, Representative Steve Womack, and Representative Rick Crawford, were not present at the ceremony, and it is not known if even they were aware of or had been invited to the "naming/designating" of the supposed White River/Watershed "Blueway". Also, no county officials of any of the affected area of Arkansas were meaningfully informed nor known to have been invited to be present at the ceremony; AND,
- 2. WHEREAS, the federal law requirements of the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) and the Clean Water Act (CWA) and other federal statutes require that all conservation programs be balanced with equal protection of the customs, cultures, and economies of the areas conserved or preserved; yet the language of the Blueway Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) contract plainly lists "cultural preservation" and "sustainable economic opportunities" to be provided for only "to the extent compatible with agency missions, goals, objectives, and priorities", while the overall language of the MOU contract is solely about grandiose schemes to "conserve" and "preserve" the entire watershed including "working lands and waters"; AND,
- 3. WHEREAS, no definition of "working lands and waters" is given in the MOU; AND,
- 4. WHEREAS, affected Arkansas counties which have adopted Comprehensive Land Use and Management Plans according to the provisions of federal law at 40CFR 1501.7(a)(1), et al, were neither informed, notified, or invited to participate in the "Blueway" process as is required by federal law, AND.
- 5. WHEREAS, such violation of federal law by federal agencies to not balance conservation and preservation with protection of custom, culture, social, and economic vitality, plus their failure to fulfill federal law requirements to inform, include, and involve county officials in all pluns and proceedings of federal/state programs and projects, etc. in our understanding thereby nullifles and volds all their bureaucratic attempts and efforts which have taken place up to this present time, for the purpose of "designating" or "naming" of White River/Watershed as a "National Blueway"; AND.
- 6. WHEREAS, the whole appearance of and the general list of participants in this ill-conceived "blueway" attempt is so reminiscent of and similar to the now infamous effort of 1996 (by the U.S. Department of Interior, U.S. Fish & Wildlife, Arkansas Game & Fish, and other state and federal agencies) to submit the same general area (Ozark Highlands/White River Basin) to the U.S. Man and Biosphere (MAB) program which had the same goals, objectives and strategies as does this "Blueway" newcomer; (the 1996 MAB attempt was abouted when former Governor Huckahee demanded AG&FC to withdraw);
