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Special Public Service Committee Minutes 2/28/2022

The Public Service meeting was called to order at 5:00 p.m. by Chairman Rogers. Those in attendance were Justice Noel and Judge Day. Justice Price and Justice Williams appeared on Zoom.

A Resolution to declare an exemption from competitive bidding for the Craighead County Sheriff's Department in purchasing 4 2022 Chevrolet Tahoe's was presented to the committee. A motion to approve was made by Justice Noel and 2nd by Justice Williams. Motion passed to move to full court for approval.

An Ordinance to amend Ordinance 2021-21; Updating the Craighead County Salary Administration Policy for Promotional Increase Eligibility was presented to the committee. Justice Price made the motion to approve, 2nd by Justice Noel. After a vote, the Ordinance will be moved to the full court for approval.

With no other business before the committee, the motion to adjourn was made by Justice Williams and 2nd by Justice Noel. The meeting adjourned at 5:05 p.m.

Finance Committee Minutes March 14, 2022



Chairman Longmire called the Finance Committee meeting to order at 5:39 pm. Present were Justices Pasmore, Cook, Pearcy and Weinstock.

Rachel Cook gave the Tax Collection report on Collector Wes Eddington's behalf. Total tax collected in February 2022 was \$1.6 million, which was up 386.2% over February 2021 collections. Rachel said that tax statements would be mailed out this week or next week. Justice Pearcy asked if tax statements were emailed? Rachel said yes.

Treasurer McNatt reported on February's financial reports. The General Fund ended with \$7.3 million. The Capital Fund had \$2.3 million, and the Road Fund ended with \$6.9 million. Sales tax collections increased 18.51% in February 2022, compared to last February. Treasurer McNatt presented the 2021 YTD comparison through month 14 and Craighead County had \$15.8 million in revenues over expenditures in 2021. That amount includes the \$10.7 million in ARP funds, but if you remove that, there is still an excess of \$5 million, which is very good. The YTD comparison for 2022 shows Craighead County with \$163,256.13 higher revenues over expenditures to date.

Chairman Longmire presented the Clean-up Ordinance for budget year 2021. A motion to accept was made by Justice Pasmore, seconded by Justice Pearcy. The motion passed and will be heard by the full court at the next meeting.

Justice Weinstock asked which attorney represents the county? Judge Day asked if there was a particular case? Justice Weinstock said no. Judge Day said Kimberly Dale is the attorney that elected officials use.

With no other business, Justice Pearcy made a motion to adjourn, seconded by Justice Weinstock. All were in favor and the Finance Committee adjourned at 5:55 pm.
